

**Dr. Badrul H. Khan**, is an author, educator, and consultant in the field of e-learning. Previously he served as Professor and Founding Director of the Educational Technology Leadership graduate cohort program at the George Washington University, and the Educational Technology graduate program at the University of Texas at Brownsville.

Professor Khan has the credit of first coining the phrase Web based instruction and popularizing the concept through his 1997 best selling Web-Based Instruction book which paved the way for the new field of e-learning. Known as the founder of modern e-learning, Dr. Khan has been honored with many awards and worldwide acclamation throughout his career. In recognition for his work in this field, the Egyptian E-Learning University Council appointed him an honorary distinguished professor of e-learning. Professor Khan has been inducted into the United States Distance Learning Association (USDLA) 2015 Hall of Fame. He authored twelve books and 100 papers in the field of e-learning and distance education. His Managing E-Learning book translated into 17 languages. He served as a consultant/advisor to e-learning and instructional design related projects for US federal government agencies, the World Bank, UNDP, Commonwealth of Learning, Asian Development Bank, Ministry of Education in several countries, and academic institutions and corporations in the USA and abroad. A sought-after keynote speaker on e-learning and blended-learning, Khan is past President (1999-2000) of the International Division of the Association for Educational and Communication Technology (AECT).
